Swiss trains are renowned for their impeccable punctuality, remarkable engineering, outstanding efficiency, and breathtaking scenic routes. On this Duke Travels adventure, you'll journey on iconic trains like the Jungfrau Railway, Glacier Express, Bernina Express, and more.



Jungfrau Railway

The Jungfrau Railway offers a unique and unforgettable journey through some of the most stunning alpine scenery in Switzerland. This railway is a renowned cogwheel train in Switzerland that transports passengers from Kleine Scheidegg to Jungfraujoch, the highest railway station in Europe at 3,454 meters (11,332 feet) above sea level. Opened in 1912, this engineering marvel offers breathtaking views of the Swiss Alps, including the iconic peaks of the Eiger, Mönch, and Jungfrau, as well as the expansive Aletsch

Glacier. These natural wonders are part of the Jungfrau region, designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site for its outstanding alpine landscapes and biodiversity.



Glacier Express

Linking Zermatt and St. Moritz, the Glacier Express is a world-renowned railway that passes through some of the most spectacular scenery in the Swiss Alps. You will traverse deep valleys, pass through picturesque villages, and cross over 290 bridges and through 91 tunnels. This iconic route showcases breathtaking landmarks such as the Landwasser Viaduct and the Oberalp Pass. With its panoramic windows offering uninterrupted views, the Glacier Express provides an unparalleled exploration of Switzerland's majestic landscapes.



Muottas Muragl Funicular

The Muottas Muragl Funicular is a historic cable railway in the Engadine region of Switzerland, providing a unique and scenic ascent from Punt Muragl to the summit of Muottas Muragl. Operating since 1907, it covers a distance of 1.37 miles with an elevation gain of 2,326 feet, offering passengers stunning views of the Engadine Valley and the surrounding Swiss Alps. This funicular is not just a means of transportation but an experience in itself, offering unparalleled views, outdoor adventures, and a touch of Swiss alpine charm.



Bernina Express

Spanning from Chur to Tirano through the breathtaking Swiss Alps, the Bernina Express is renowned as an iconic train journey in Switzerland. This UNESCO World Heritage route includes landmarks such as the Landwasser Viaduct and ascends to the Bernina Pass at 7,392 feet above sea level. You'll revel in panoramic vistas of glaciers, majestic mountain peaks, and picturesque villages seen through expansive train windows.



Vitznau-Rigi Railway

The Vitznau-Rigi Railway, inaugurated in 1871, holds the distinction of being Europe's first cogwheel mountain railway. It ascends from Vitznau, nestled along the shores of Lake Lucerne, to Rigi Kulm, offering passengers breathtaking panoramas of Lake Lucerne, the Swiss Alps, and the surrounding countryside. Climbing to an impressive altitude of 5,899 feet above sea level, this historic railway operates year-round, providing access to hiking trails, dining options, and accommodations atop Mount Rigi.

Itinerary

DAY 1 | SUNDAY, JUNE 22

U.S. * Zürich, Switzerland

Depart U.S. on an overnight flight to Zurich.

DAY 2 | MONDAY, JUNE 23 **Zürich**

Upon arrival in Zürich, we will take a private group transfer to our hotel in Interlaken. After some free time to relax, we'll gather for a welcome aperitivo, a delightful tradition that blends social interaction, delicious snacks, and a refreshing drink. This will be an opportunity to get to know each other and receive an overview of the trip. Dinner is at leisure this evening.

DAY 3 | TUESDAY, JUNE 24 *Interlaken* ** *Grindelwald First*

This morning, we will depart early for a full-day excursion to Grindelwald First, a region known for its stunning scenery of the Swiss Alps. Accompanied by our local hiking guide, we will board a train from Interlaken to the village of Grindelwald. From there, we will continue up the mountain via an aerial gondola. We will venture onto the Grindelwald First Cliff Walk which leads to a panoramic viewing platform designed to make visitors feel as though they are floating above the alpine landscape. After lunch, we will hike to the Bachalpsee, known for its crystalclear waters and panoramic views of the surrounding mountains. We will descend back to the glacial village of Grindelwald and return to Interlaken via train.

CARLTON HOTEL (B, L) / 3.7 MILE INTERMEDIATE ROUND-TRIP HIKE (ELEVATION +/-390 FEET)

DAY 4 | WEDNESDAY, JUNE 25 **Jungfraujoch**

Today we will embark on a full-day guided tour to Jungfraujoch. We will depart Interlaken on the Jungfrau Railway for a 2-hour panoramic train ride to Europe's highest railway station (11,332 feet above sea level). Upon arrival, we will have magnificent views of the longest glacier in the Alps from the Sphinx Observation Terrace and explore the tunnels of the Ice Palace. After some leisure time for lunch, we will enjoy the Jungfrau Eiger Walk, a pleasant hike from the Eigergletscher station down to the Kleine Scheidegg station. We will return to Interlaken by train and gather

for dinner at a local restaurant. CARLTON HOTEL (B, D) / 1.5 MILE EASY HIKE (ELEVATION -850 FEET)

DAY 5 | THURSDAY, JUNE 26

Glacier Express to St. Moritz

After breakfast, we will take a private transfer to Andermatt to board the world-famous Glacier Express to St. Moritz. This breathtaking journey will take us over mountain passes, across numerous bridges, and through many tunnels. We will enjoy lunch on this luxurious train while taking in the panoramic views as we make our way to the Upper Engadine Valley. Upon arrival, we will check into our accommodation in St. Moritz and spend the evening at our leisure. Optional baggage assistance is available upon request for boarding and disembarking the Glacier Express Train. HOTEL STEFFANI (B, L,)

DAY 6 | FRIDAY, JUNE 27

St. Moritz * Punt Muragl

We will begin our day with a 15-minute walk to the St. Moritz railway station to take a short train ride to Punt Muragl. From here, we will enjoy a scenic excursion to the Muottas Muragl peak using a funicular which has an incline up to 56%. Once we reach the top, there







will be time for a leisurely lunch with a view. We will return to St. Moritz for a lecture by Dr. Heidi Madden, followed by an exclusive visit to the Museum Segantini (pending confirmation). Here, we will delve into the life and artistic contributions of the renowned Italian painter Giovanni Segantini. This evening, we will dine at the Hotel Steffani. HOTEL STEFFANI (B,D)

DAY 7 | SATURDAY, JUNE 28

St. Moritz * Bernina Pass * Poschiavo

Today, we will ride the legendary Bernina Express, the highest mountain railway in the Alps, to the heart of Italian-speaking Switzerland. We'll take in extraordinary views of the Morteratsch Glacier from the train's panoramic windows as we climb to the highest point at Ospizio Bernina, 7,392 feet above sea level. From here, we will descend to the town of Poschiavo to meet a local guide for a tour of the charming historic center and a delicious tasting of local products. Following lunch at a local restaurant, we'll return to St. Moritz via the Bernina Express in the afternoon and enjoy the rest of the day at leisure. HOTEL STEFFANI (B,L)

DAY 8 | SUNDAY, JUNE 29

Lucerne

Today we depart St. Moritz via a

spectacular drive through alpine scenery to Lake Lucerne. Upon arrival in Lucerne, we will check in to our accommodation and enjoy a guided walking tour through the historic center and along the medieval Musegg Wall. We'll uncover ancient secrets as we stroll along charming cobblestone streets, admire iconic wooden bridges, and become captivated by the rich tales of the city's past. Later in the afternoon, we will attend a lecture by Dr. Heidi Madden. HOTEL WILDEN MANN (B, L)

DAY 9 | MONDAY, JUNE 30

Lucerne * Mount Rigi

Today we will go on a journey to Mount Rigi, the "Queen of the Mountains". Our adventure will begin with a serene boat ride across the pristine waters of Lake Lucerne, offering picturesque views of the surrounding Swiss Alps. Upon reaching the base of Mount Rigi, we will board the Vitznau-Rigi Railway, the oldest mountain railway in Europe. As we ascend, we will be captivated by the lush forests, vibrant meadows, and stunning panoramic views. From the observation point of Rigi Kulm, we'll cross idyllic meadows to the "Känzeli" viewpoint and continue to the charming village of Rigi Kaltbad. After some leisure time for lunch, we will return to Lucerne by train and ferry. This evening, we will gather for a farewell dinner.
